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
# How Can We Describe Weather and Seasons?








Weather is what the air outside is like. Weather can be sunny, snowy, rainy, or windy.








The weather can change from day to day. Sometimes it changes in one day.




Wind is moving air.

# Responding

#### **Draw Different Kinds of Weather**

Ask children to draw a picture of any kind of weather. Have them take turns showing their pictures to the rest of the class. Ask children to state sentences that describe the weather shown in their pictures. Record their sentences on the board. Challenge children to identify the season the weather may depict.

### Sequence the Seasons

Have children explain the repeating pattern of seasons by copying and completing the following sentences.

 comes	after	winter.
 comes	after	spring.
 comes	after	summer
 comes	after	fall.
