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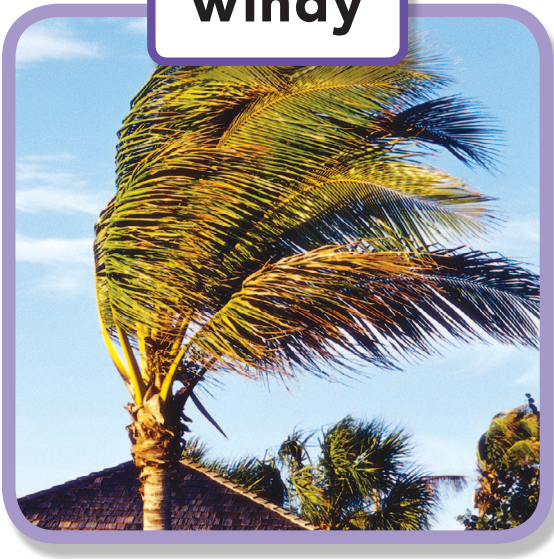
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windy

air moving a little

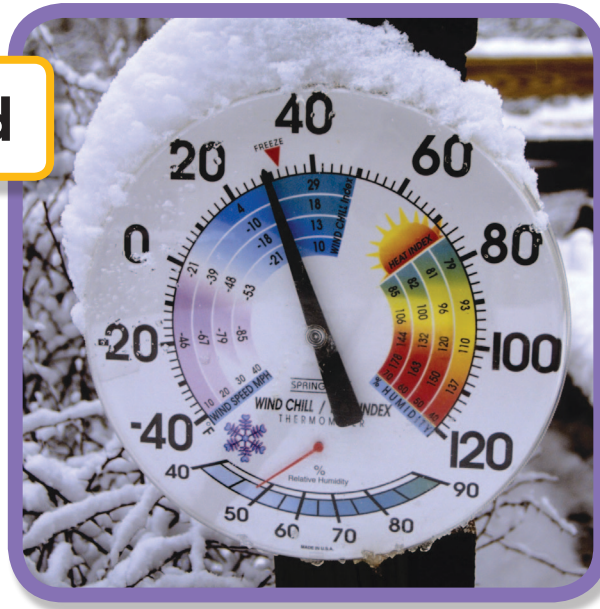


air moving a lot

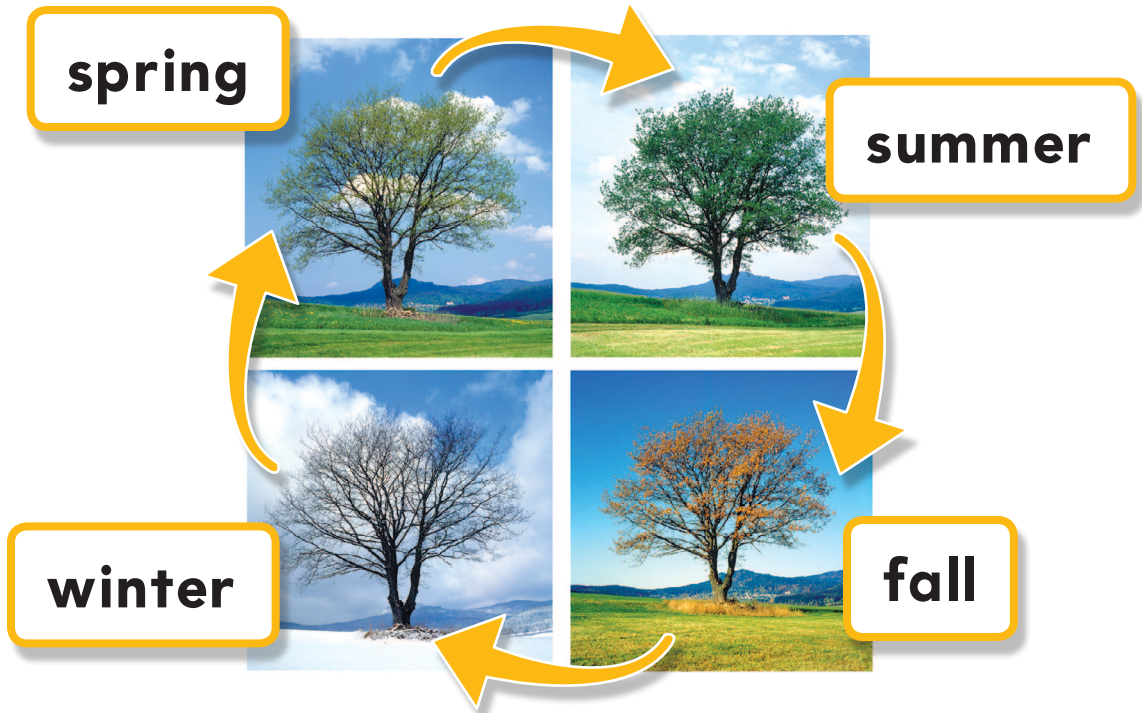
Wind is moving air.

Responding

Draw Different Kinds of Weather

Ask children to draw a picture of any kind of weather. Have them take turns showing their pictures to the rest of the class. Ask children to state sentences that describe the weather shown in their pictures. Record their sentences on the board. Challenge children to identify the season the weather may depict.
