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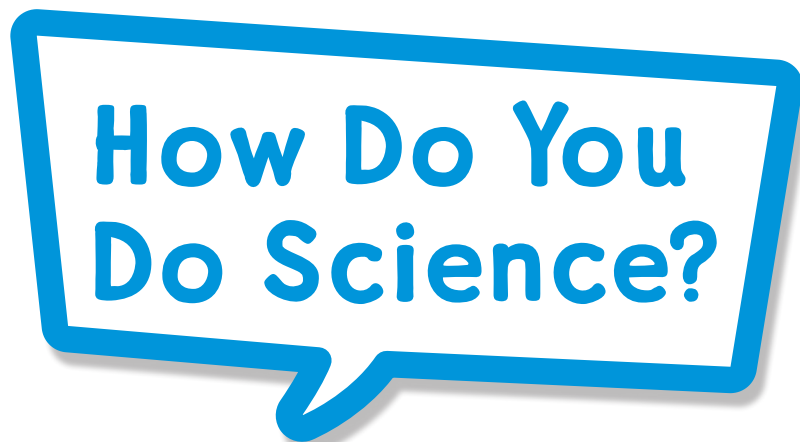
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Science is asking questions and looking for answers.

We stay safe by following these science rules.

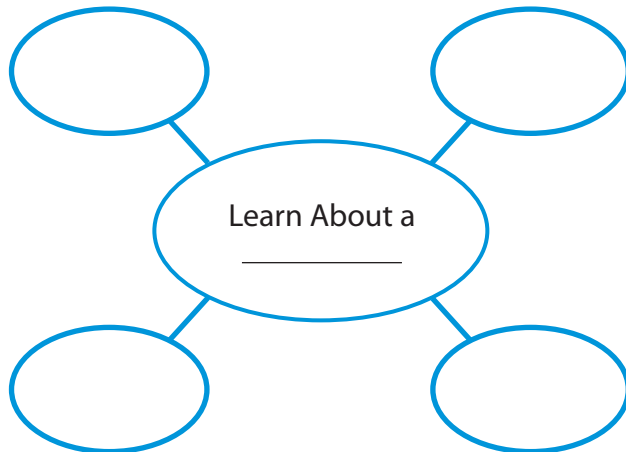
Responding
